Safety first, that is, until she herself forgets the rules of the game in a cunning tale that will surprise young readers with its most unpredictable ending!









Les Nymphéas

Claude Monet (1840 - 1926)

remarquable trouva son accomplissement dans que son œil percevait. Cette invention picturale la magistrale série des Nymphéas que l'homme politique Georges Clemenceau, ami de Monet, commanda au peintre, à la fin de la Première Guerre mondiale. À Paris, au cœur de la salle du musée de l'Orangerie qui leur est dédiée, le regard du spectateur se perd, s'engloutit, renaît au gré de l'éblouissante création de couleur qui séduit, corps et âme.

La couleur nous absorbe entièrement quand nous regardons le grand triptyque jaune de Joan Mitchell. Artiste américaine, influencée par l'art de Jackson Pollock, Mitchell s'installa en France à la fin des années 1950. Bien qu'elle se soit toujours défendue du rapprochement de ses créations avec celles de Monet, elle s'était installée à Vétheuil, village tout près de Giverny où Monet conçut ses œuvres après 1890. Mitchell se nourrit de la nature, de ses variations, de ses rythmes lumineux, tout en se détachant d'une représentation immédiate et littérale.

La couleur comme principe

a couleur, est-ce cela qui fait un artiste? Sa capacité à les choisir, à les mélanger, à les opposer? Regarder une toile de Claude Monet, c'est comme plonger dans la couleur. Une couleur vibrante, harmonieuse, puissante, qui semble envahir l'œuvre tout entière et charme nos yeux. Dès ses premières œuvres, le jeune Claude Monet porta un intérêt particulier à la couleur. Il avait en tête la leçon d'Eugène Delacroix et avait fait sienne la théorie des contrastes colorés où les couleurs opposées - le bleu et l'orange, par exemple se répondent et s'exaltent, faisant jaillir la lumière. Le procédé des séries le conduisit à choisir un motif - la façade de la cathédrale de Rouen, une meule de foin, les nénuphars de l'étang de son jardin et de le répéter, au gré des jours, des heures, du passage des nuages et de celui du soleil. Le sujet de sa toile devenait alors, moins que le monument, le foin ou les fleurs, la variation colorée et lumineuse


HÉLIO AND HIS WORDS

Aurélien wonders whether or not he wants to live with his parents any longer and Cécile, what really caused the accident that landed her in the hospital in the first place.




