


Anne Crausaz

My skin fades out from pink to white. Munch munch, crunch my flesh with a touch of salt. It stings! Who am I? The radish.



Les Trois Gibbons et la chanson du colibri (The Three Gibbons and the Hummingbird's Song)






Comme ci, comme ça (I'm This I'm That)

Two bunnies are having a chat at night. "Can I tell you a secret? I am scared of the wolf."


"Really? Why's that?"


Sous le soleil (Under the Sun)


Mon bison (My Buffalo)

"The first time I saw him, it was springtime.


I was in the tall grass, I couldn't see an awful lot being all of four years old."



Josephine is a rich but very lonely little girl. Her mum, a famous pianist, vanished a long time ago. While her father, an important businessman, is always on the other side of the world.







Laurent le Flamboyant (Laurent the Flamboyant)






