Aurore Petit

A huge sense of pride, widely expressed anger and unfailing determination: strong emotions guaranteed!

Aurore Petit is focusing for this 4th title about her family series on her "big little girl", hence ending her autobiographical work - for the time being. With infinite tenderness, she describes this tricky period when little children become more independent and push further and further their limits: the famous terrible two! The first-person narrator and the vivid and joyful illustrations, sometimes also from the narrator's point of view, render with great accuracy the sensations of this unique age, oscillating between fragility and an astounding self-confidence

The little girl introduces the reader to her universe; her own self-conscience goes through opposition but also a strong affirmation of her capacities and her choices. She is slowly but surely leaving the world of babies, meanwhile forging her identity and personality. A grown-up is always figured by her side to accompany her on the sometimes-complex path of autonomy, but mostly out of frame, figured by a pair of arms or feet. This permanent discrepancy between text and image reinforces the child's touching awkwardness and makes the whole matter sweet and very funny.

STRONG POINTS:

- After A Mother is α House, Baby Belly and Little Sister is α Diplodocus, the latest (and last) opus of the successful series by Aurore Petit.
- In this new picture book, Aurore Petit tackles with tenderness and kindness what the childhood professionals call the "terrible two".
- A book that is touching and comical at the same time!

- A book that will appeal to both children and adults.





Adèle Verlinden


Mojo, the fancy pussy, desperately tries to find the perfect spot for a good nap, but everything seems to work against him...

Mojo is tired. Like the good cat he is, he stretches, he spreads out, yawns with all his teeth. He is looking for the perfect corner, the cozy nest out of sight, where he can FINALLY rest; but wherever he goes, he is disturbed. In the garden, there are drafts; under the shrubs, he gets jostled by a grumpy mole; inside, on the windowsill, the noises of the city dislodge him... Poor Mojo, he can never be alone! Fortunately, the arms of his owner are waiting for him...

The disproportionate shapes, the bright colours of the gouache illustrations wonderfully serve the poetic text and transform a simple story into a great adventure. Mojo, the fancy pussy, is the cat who personifies the love declaration from Adèle Verlinden to felines!

STRONG POINTS:

- A story full of twists and turns, like a chain-folktale, that will appeal to young readers.


Adèle Verlinden

Claire Schvartz



Except that the little human has lost her «drib» and panic ensues: the giants will not leave until the little human has found this famous drib.

Insects and humans start looking for it. A quest during which the two universes will cross over in an astonishing and hilarious way. To the delight of children, whether they are insects, humans or... just readers of this adventure between friends of all sizes!

STRONG POINTS:

- With her first two picture books, Claire Schvartz has completely established and is recognized by professionals. One Night at The Insect'Hotel sold more than 4,000 copies in France and has been translated into five languages. She is one of the illustrators who now matter in French children's books publishing.
- We meet again with the unique and delightful universe of Claire Schvartz and her hilarious families of insects. The art of storytelling, close here to a comic strip, as well as the rhythm and suspense are in full force in this adventure filled with twists and turns!
- Friendship, a strong taste for adventure and independence: this title tackles the themes dear to Claire Schvartz and the little ones.






Claire Schvartz



Jean-Baptiste Drouot



None of them came back. In a last glitch of hope, they send Oskar the cat, the village cheesemaker, to confront the horrible count Darkula! Oskar discovers to his own astonishment that Darkula is just a tiny little mouse! But be careful: Darkula is not just any mouse, but a lady mouse determined to subdue all these cats – including Oskar, her last visitor...


What if Nono

A tender yet joyful picture book about the peculiar time of grief and loss.

She brings together all her friends, Beaver, Otter, Toad and Po, Toad's son, who adores Turtle, to let them know. Then, before closing her eyes for the last time, Turtle gives each of her friends a loving handmade souvenir. Little Po inherits a large reed and a small, mysterious nail. Simple objects which will nevertheless allow, when the time has come, to gather and celebrate Turtle.

An infinitely sweet picture book to talk to little ones about grief. A magnificent and subtle text, dynamic and joyful illustrations: a superb duo of two true artists, who bring to life an exceptionally powerful story... which is not even sad.
