Ivan Péault & Mona Granjon


At Pat the Worm's restaurant, the menu is deliciously disgusting. The scenery, in the middle of the compost heap, is very welcoming, and the dishes are unforgettable. To vomit for!

Pat is a worm AND a restaurant owner. Like all great chefs, his wish is to receive his very own star in the very posh Revolting Culinary Guide. But one day, unfortunately, the hand that had been giving Pat delicious rotten produce until then tears it/him Pat away from his compost. He is now tied to the end of a fishing rod! Luckily for him, Pat manages to save his life by befriending the fish and making a pact with them: no way will should they turn into soup!

The laugh out loud funny and fanciful universes of author Ivan Péault and illustrator Mona Granjon beautifully match in this book. Indeed, it is the story of a very smart worm with its own culinary star and deliciously moldy pasta dishes, but underneath it also tackles ecology, compost, waste processing and whether we should eat animals.

STRONG POINTS:

- A text filled with humor and disgusting, (sorry!) amazing wordplays and energetic illustrations, as funny as the text
- A book that also makes us question our relationship to food waste and makes us aware of the crucial role the little creatures that dwell in our gardens can play.


Ivan Péault

Just like Constance, we are all little butterflies who need to find their place in the world. Follow Constance to the Beetles Theatre and discover how a collective project can make the world a nicer place to live in!

« Constance got up on the wrong side of the bed. She's feeling slightly purple, slightly blue... »

Constance the butterfly didn't start the day in the best way. Her bath is lukewarm, the breakfast nectar tastes different, and her toast fell on the buttered side. She would have loved for the day to be over before it started, but her insect colleagues are waiting for her. Constance is a make-up artist at the Beetles Theatre. Isidorus, the stage designer, will eagerly ask her to give him a hand, just like Susan-Lucy, the lighting designer. She will also help Bertha, the costume designer, and try for her a rabbit costume.

Constance under the spotlights invites the reader to witness the tense febrility that precedes a performance, tackling the world of theater and its various professions.

STRONG POINTS:

- In a society that has become more and more individualistic, *Constance* enhances, on the contrary, the importance of keeping busy and creative, in movement, of going towards the others to feel good and the joy of belonging to a group project.
- After *The Wild Ducks* (Les Canards sauvages, 2022), this is the fourth picture book by Adèle Jolivard published with Les Fourmis rouges. Her work is, as always, subtle and intricate!




Adèle Jolivard




Jean-Baptiste Drouot



- A book that will appeal to both children and adults.





Claire Schvartz



- Friendship, a strong taste for adventure and independence: this title tackles the themes dear to Claire Schvartz and the little ones.



In the garden, there are drafts; under the shrubs, he gets jostled by a grumpy mole; inside, on the windowsill, the noises of the city dislodge him... Poor Mojo, he can never be alone! The disproportionate shapes, the bright colours of the gouache illustrations wonderfully serve the poetic text and transform a simple story into a great adventure. Mojo, the fancy pussy, is the cat who personifies the love declaration from Adèle Verlinden to felines!

Aurore Petit


A huge sense of pride, widely expressed anger and unfailing determination: strong emotions guaranteed!

Aurore Petit is focusing for this 4th title about her family series on her "big little girl", hence ending her autobiographical work – for the time being. With infinite tenderness, she describes this tricky period when little children become more independent and push further and further their limits: the famous terrible two! The first-person narrator and the vivid and joyful illustrations, sometimes also from the narrator's point of view, render with great accuracy the sensations of this unique age, oscillating between fragility and an astounding selfconfidence.

The little girl introduces the reader to her universe; her own self-conscience goes through opposition but also a strong affirmation of her capacities and her choices. She is slowly but surely leaving the world of babies, meanwhile forging her identity and personality.


The Ghost in Briefs

Darn, it looks like Nono stuck his finger in your book's fold! What if things get out of hand and Nono is stuck forever in the book?



A wacky and playful story built around the book itself, which says a lot about children's imagination and literature.




